### Information for Parents:

Your child will receive information about careers during their time at the Walton High. We will provide opportunities for them to develop life skills and core competencies that employer's value, by enabling them to take part in employment and enterprise events.

How can you help your child with careers and employability? There is so much you can do to support your son or daughter:

- Show a genuine interest! Talk to them regularly about their ideas for the future and ask them what they see themselves doing
- Talk to them about what you do as a job – and other job roles you have had
- Ask your employer if they would allow you to bring your child to work one day (during school holidays)
- In Years 10 and 11 students could look at the Post 16 provision at Walton High and other providers' websites, to see what courses are available (please see links in the useful links section below)
- Help them to explore the possible employers, apprenticeship providers and further education courses available in the local area. You should be able to find lots of useful information on these things using a range of websites including Unifrog and SEMLEP. The Local Council may have other information. (Use the Careers Explorers tool using <https://www.semlep.com/school-labour-market-information/> )

- Keep an eye out for things like Open Days (at colleges and training organisations) and careers fairs held locally, details can be found on college websites and on the school website/careers section of Firefly
- Help them to understand the alternative post-16 options. Find out more about apprenticeships here:

- Encourage them to participate in out of school activities. These are valuable in themselves and will help greatly later on in giving a good impression to people like employers or course tutors.

#### Teachers:


